Equestrian Canada General Rules – Gold and Bronze Divisions

Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of Equestrian Canada (EC) and will be held and judged in accordance with the current EC General Regulations and Dressage Rule Book Section E. (A602.2) Knowledge of the rules is the responsibility of the competitor. Please direct any questions regarding rules to the stewards on the grounds at the competition. (A801)

Every entry at an Equestrian Canada sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the Equestrian Canada (EC) constitution and all rules of Equestrian Canada. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions, to be knowledgeable regarding the Equestrian Canada constitution, applicable Equestrian Canada rules and any additional rules imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition. (A602.7)

Statement of Principle

Equestrian Canada, the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction. Equestrian Canada is committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of the horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- Ensuring that owners, trainers and exhibitors or their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure;
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- Requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competition;
- Reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horses.

The standard by which conduct, or treatment will be measured is that which a person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.

Canadian Cup Dressage Festival – General Rules

All Competitors are required by EC rules to wear proper fitting, approved protection headgear, with the safety harness correctly secured, at all times while mounted on the competition or event grounds.

Approved headgear meets the ASTM (American Society for Testing Materials) standards and displays the SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) seal. The British Standard, BSI, is also acceptable. (A802.6)

All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Equestrian Canada Rules, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations. (A602)

Equine Medication control fees are mandatory for Equestrian Canada competitions and must be included with entry fees on entry form. Gold Fee \$7.00 Bronze Fee \$4.00 “Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event. (A602.5)

An EC Dressage Levy fee of \$10.00 per horse which is payable to Equestrian Canada Dressage Committee and included on Entry form which is a mandatory fee.

Horse Identification numbers are required for Gold Division entries. The Horse ID number replaces horse passports. All Gold division horses are required to be registered with a current Equestrian Canada Horse Identification number or must pay a Temporary Horse License fee when checking in at Show Office.

Horse Identification registration is available online through the EC online sport license renewal process at Equestrian Canada www.equestrian.ca Please complete this process or contact Equestrian Canada for assistance prior to submitting your entries to transition an existing horse passport to the Horse Identification number; or to obtain a Horse ID number for a new horse that does not have an ID number for Gold division entries. For assistance contact EC Toll Free @ 1-866-282-8395

Bronze division horses are not required to have EC Horse Identification numbers. (A602.4)

Neither Maple Ridge Equi-Sport Center, any employee, volunteer, or member of the organizing committee will be held responsible in any way for damage, injury, or loss to persons, horses or property of spectators, owners, trainers, riders, or grooms.

The Canadian Cup Dressage Festival Organizing Committee reserves the right to limit the number of entries, refuse any entry for any reason, or to split, cancel, combine, and or adjust any class or awards presented subject to entries and at their sole discretion. The Organizing Committee reserves the right to govern all conditions of the competition, and to make decisions on matters that are not specified in the EC Rulebook in consultation with EC stewards.

The maximum number of tests per horse per day permitted at this competition is four tests, regardless of the number of competition levels, categories, and or horse / rider combinations entered in the competition. Horse / rider combinations may not enter more than two consecutive levels at the same competition.

Competition numbers assigned and provided by show office are always required to be worn by the horse or rider/ or handler when outside the stall. Failure to display the number may result in first a warning card and second offense possible disqualification. Please do not use any other type of number on horse other than the number assigned and provided by the show office.

All Gold and Bronze Division riders and owners are required to hold a minimum of a current EC Gold or Bronze Sport License (or proof of purchase), and a current Horse Council BC membership which are

purchased online. EC Sport Licences are purchased online prior to entering the competition at <https://www.equestrian.ca> Current Horse Council BC memberships are purchased online prior to entering the competition at <https://www.hcbc.ca/> Please complete all EC & HCBC license requirements online prior to the closing date of entries for verification by show secretary. Sport Licence and membership cards are **not** submitted with entry forms, as verification occurs online prior to the competition. Temporary Gold sport licenses are available and payable to EC at the competition. There is no temporary Bronze sport license. Competitors must check in on arrival to show grounds.

Foreign Riders must provide an electronic copy of their National Federation current membership card on arrival at the competition and complete the EC Foreign Horse Affidavit Form in the show office.

Late Entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Organizing Committee for an additional late fee of \$25.00. Please submit one Entry Form Package for each horse / rider combination. Parents or Legal Guardian of youth exhibitors must sign all forms as the person responsible for any Youth competitor 18 years old or under on the entry date. Hors Concours entries may be accepted at the sole discretion of show management.

Entry Forms will be accepted by email only including four pages of completed entry form and entry agreement, credit card authorization on entry form, Health and Wellness Declaration forms with all signatures as required by the Entry Closing date. Incomplete entries or credit card information lacking on entry forms will not be accepted. Declined credit cards may be charged a \$15 additional handling fee

All Gold and Bronze division entries must be received by **Saturday, July 2nd, 2021. 9pm** Entries will be accepted by EMAIL ONLY received by the closing date, or by email with credit card authorization provided on entry form. Please submit all completed entry forms to **Ali Buchanan at alibuchanan1@gmail.com** Entry forms must be attached to an email with all information and signatures completed. Scanned images or clear photographs are accepted. Please print clearly on all forms to avoid errors.

Payment is required with entry forms received in form of credit card authorization details provided on entry form, payable to M.R.E.C. received not later than the Entry Closing date. Visa or MasterCard credit cards accepted. Entries with no payment deposit will not be accepted.

Entry Secretary will confirm receipt of entries with an email confirmation when accepted. Please review entry confirmation carefully to ensure all information is correct as submitted when confirmation is received. Please notify entry secretary of any discrepancies, errors, or omissions immediately by email when entry confirmation is received, and no entry change fee will apply. Any entry change requested after the entry confirmation has been accepted may incur an entry change fee of \$15.00 additional handling fee.

Substitution of Horses entered will be accepted at the discretion of the Organizing Committee when received not later than 12:00 noon, on Thursday prior to start of competition. Horse substitution will be accepted where the horse substituted is entered in the same classes as the original entry. Substitution at a different level than the original entry may not be possible to accommodate, however, if possible may be accepted at the discretion of the Organizing Committee.

Music for Freestyles must be submitted in the form of a tested audio formatted compact disk (CD) only,

when checking in at show office. Include your name on the CD and on the CD case. A sound check will be scheduled prior to the Freestyle classes with day and time posted in the competition office and announced. Horses are not required to attend the sound check.

Ride Times Schedule will be posted at www.mrec.ca and on Fox Village Ride Times & Results link click here: [Fox Village Results](#) prior to the competition. Ride times will be emailed to all competitors in the competition where email address is provided on entry forms. Final Ride times will be posted at the competition.

Splitting or Combining of Rider Categories Junior, Adult Amateur, or Open: If there are fewer than three entries in any category of an Open class, entries will not split into separate categories for class placings. Instead, they may be combined into one Open class at the discretion of the Organizing Committee. Classes will be split into rider categories and placed separately for classes where 3 or more entries per category are entered in the class. The class will be placed accordingly for each category when results are posted on the scoreboard.

Competition & Warm-up Rings will be designated for the competitions. Competition rings will be available for schooling on warmup day 1pm – 7pm on Thursday prior to the start of competition. The Competition arena (s) will always be closed to all horses after 7pm Thursday prior to start of show and remain closed during competition. Warmup arenas will remain open for the duration of the competition hours.

Stabling and Tack Stalls for the Gold and Bronze competition horses will be in either the Indoor arena or permanent stabling as required. Cost of stalls is \$185.00 for 4 days from 12 noon Thursday, to 7pm Sunday of the show. Sawdust bedding is provided. Stalls may be occupied after 12 noon Thursday, the day prior to competition.

Competitors wishing to arrive early must confirm and have approval directly with show manager by email prior to arrival. A fee of \$25.00 + GST per day will apply for horses arriving prior to Thursday move in warm up day. Refunds on stall fees after the stalls have been assigned are at the sole discretion of show manager.

Haul in Horses – All horses not stabled on grounds must pay a daily haul-in grounds fee of \$35.00 + GST for each day on grounds including warm up day. Haul-in fees are payable on entry form. Haul in parking is only permitted in designated parking lot on Cross Country Field north side of show grounds.

Ribbons awarded to sixth place in all classes. Dressage tests will be placed in envelopes for pick up each day with name of Rider on envelopes at the show office

Test of Choice (TOC) classes include all EC National and FEI tests except Freestyle tests. TOC Class numbers, Name, and test number must be listed on entry form for all test of choice classes. Horse Council BC western dressage tests will be used. Please specify test preference on the entry form. Current HCBC rules will govern Western Dressage classes.

Para Equestrian Test of Choice classes will include all the para-equestrian Grades in one open class. Current FEI PE Tests will be used. Indicate on the entry form which Grade and FEI test of choice is requested for Para Equestrian TOC classes.

Schooling Horse entries are permitted for the duration of the competition for a fee of \$105.00 for show.

All EC rules and show fees apply except for EC Sport licenses, Dressage Canada membership, Equine medication and levy fees are not applicable. Schooling horse entries must complete all entry forms and be received prior the closing date to avoid the late fees. Schooling horses will be assigned an entry number which must always be worn when outside of stall and on competition grounds.

Tack Checks are the responsibility of the competitor to present themselves to the Ring Steward for a tack check immediately following their ride. Failure to do so may incur elimination. It is the competitor's responsibility to check in with the Ring Steward at the competition arena gate at least 10 minutes prior to their ride time. Competitors on deck should remain in the competition holding ring under the supervision of ring stewards until their ride time. Competitors arriving late for any ride time may be eliminated at the discretion of the Judge.

Test Callers are permitted in all national level classes and must be provided by the competitor. All FEI Tests must be performed by memory in all divisions. Whips to a maximum length of 1.20m (1.0m for ponies) and may be carried in all national Gold or Bronze Division classes.

Championship "C" classes are designated on Saturday and Sunday competition days. The two "C" classes of each level must be both ridden with the average combined percentage of the Test 2 and Test 3 determining the Championship and Reserve Championship standings for each level and category. Championship categories will be split and awarded where there are 3 or more entries per category in a championship class or division. Where there are less than 3 entries in a championship rider category scores will be included in the Open Championship division.

Rider Times schedule will make every effort to accommodate each horse rider combination allowing for suitable warm up time for all tests entered. A minimum of 40 minutes between start of ride times will be the minimum time allowed between tests scheduled. When it is not possible to schedule a rider's times within the minimum 40 minutes warm up the competitor will be notified, and class fee refunded.

Competition Office will be open for check in on Thursday, from 12 noon to 7 pm. The Show Office will open each morning 45 minutes prior to the start of the first scheduled ride time each day.

Lunging is permitted only in designated lunging arena on the cross country field

One Test may be entered in Test of Choice classes. Test of Choice classes are placed on total percentages for all tests listed in the class. Classes may be scheduled at any time on the day listed in the prize list and in any order. Ride times will be altered only in the case of an error, overlapping times, or to facilitate the running of the show due to unforeseen circumstances. Current Day Sheets will be posted on scoreboard.

Categories for each level offered are Youth (18 years and under as of January 1 of the current year, Adult Amateur, and Open: Refer to EC Rulebook for eligibility requirements. Date of birth must be included on entry form for all youth competitors.

Any protest at an EC sanctioned competition other than those covered in division rules must comply with the following provisions: a) a protest is eligible only if made by an officiating judge, owner, lessee, trainer, coach, rider or authorized agent in the division in which the question arises; b) the protest must be made in writing and addressed to the Show Secretary; c) protest must be signed; and d) must be accompanied by a deposit of \$100 in cash. Vet Out / Refunds and Scratch Entries

Refund Policies: Cancellations before the Entry closing date, with or without veterinary or medical certificate will receive all fees refunded less the Administration fee which is non-refundable.

Cancellations after the Entry closing date and before the start of competition received by the show secretary with a veterinary or medical certificate in writing will be refunded 50% of Class fees, Equine Medication and levy fees, and GST on refunded amounts. Administration fee and 50 % of class fees are non-refundable. Stall fees may be refunded at the discretion of the Show Manager where stalls have not been occupied.

Canadian Cup Dressage Festival Gold Division Championships

All Dressage division Championships will be determined by combining the total percentage scores awarded in the 2 Championship Classes "C" of the level for each horse/rider combination. The competitor with the highest average percentage from the two "C" Classes shall be declared the Champion, and the competitor with the second highest total averaged percentage shall be declared the Reserve Champion. In the event of a tie, the competitor with the highest total percentage in the Test 3 will be declared the Champion. Championships will be awarded in all rider categories Youth, Adult Amateur, and Open where a minimum of 3 or more exhibitors compete in the Championship Classes. Competitors must enter a minimum of 3 tests at the competition to be eligible for Championship Division awards.

Rising Stars Equitation Division - Specifications

The Rising Stars Equitation Division has been created to emphasize the importance of equitation and its influence and effect on the performance of the horse. If a competition is dual sanctioned with both Bronze and Gold Divisions, a Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded in both Divisions subject to entries. Divisions and age categories may be split or combined subject to entries.

Gold Division

Training, First, and Second levels

Bronze Division

Introductory, Training, and First levels

The Riders equitation skills will be evaluated and judged by a second judge during the regular Championship Test 2 “C” technical test for each level and division. The class will be judged by two judges with the Technical judge seated at C, and a Equitation judge seated at H or M who will be evaluating only the rider’s equitation during the technical test. A Rising Stars Equitation score sheet will be used for this division.

Scores from the Rising Stars Equitation scoresheet will be calculated with the top 2 scores in each age category, and or level qualifying those riders for the Dressage Seat Equitation class which will be run as group class on Sunday. Riders from the Gold and Bronze divisions depending on entries divisions may be combined for Dressage Seat Equitation classes and ride off to determine the top 2 Overall Rising Star Champion and Reserve Champion. The top 2 riders from each Division are then qualified to enter the Rising Stars Season Final. All scores will be posted and published.

Canadian Cup – Bronze Division – Class List

The Bronze Division Competition is restricted to Youth and Adult Amateur Competitors only. Exception: Western Dressage Division and Introductory Classes are Open Divisions. Western Dressage is a non-EC division. HCBC Western Dressage Rules and tests will be used.

All General Rules of the Gold Division apply to Bronze entries as stated in prize list general rules. Equestrian Canada Horse ID numbers are not required. EC Bronze Sport License is required and can be purchased online at www.equestrian.ca Ribbons to 6th placings in all bronze division classes.

Training and First Level Youth and Adult Amateur categories must also ride the Dressage Seat Equitation “C” Classes to be eligible with scores counting for Bronze Championship awards. Equitation score is combined with the Test 2 C and Test 3 “C” scores. The combined total percentages scores of 3 “C” classes determine Champions and Reserve Champions for Training and First level Youth and Adult Amateur Bronze Division Championships at each Level. Awards may be collected at the awards table when Championship results are posted Respect social Distancing protocols.
